


HISTORICAL DATA SINKING VALLEY GRANCE

Sinking Valley Grange No. 484, Patrons of Husbandry, the oldest subordinate Grange in Blair County, was organized February 24, 1875, and for 100 years has been a great influence in the social, agriculture and community activities in Tyrone Township.

After the group of farmers in Sinking Valley discussed the idea of organizing a Grange at the election in February of 1875, little time was lost in securing 20 charter members. On February 24, 1875, sixteen of the twenty persons who had signed the application for the charter met in the second floor of the large spring house on the Ephriam Burket farm, now operated by his great grandson, John W. Burket. At this time the first officers were elected as follows:

Ephriam Burket, master; Thomas M. Fleck, overseer; J. C. Stryker, lecturer; W. W. Stryker, steward; George W. Bridenbaugh, assistant steward; J. T. Stryker, chaplain; H. H. Bridenbaugh, treasurer; Eli F. Fleck, secretary; James Roseberry, gatekeeper; Miss Ella A. Bridenbaugh, Ceres; Mrs. Eli F. Fleck, Pomona; Mrs. J. C. Stryker, Flora; Mrs. Ephriam Burket, lady assistant steward; Gebriel Fleck, F. W. Bridenbaugh and William Sprankle, trustees. The other charter members were Mrs. Thomas M. Fleck, Miss Clara J. Fleck, A. L. Fleck, and Mrs. R. W. Bridenbaugh. The election was conducted by Thomas Bell, deputy master for Huntingdon County, who also installed the officers, being assisted by W. W. Stryker, master of the Petersburg Grange.

The Grange continued to meet for thirteen years at the Burket farm when the increasing membership made it necessary to secure larger quarters. The Grange then moved to the building in Skelp owned by Thomas M. Fleck, known as the Ellenberger home and now as the Howard Hoover home. Here the Grange held its meetings for 42 years. In 1928 the Grange decided to build its

own hall which was to be used as a grange meeting place and community center. John R. Crawford was then the master. The building was finally completed during the winter of 1929, and the first meeting was held in the new hall on January 2, 1930 with 50 members present. The building was officially dedicated at a public "house warming" March 4, 1930, with 260 present. The lot upon which the grange hall is located was donated to the Grange by Mr. and Mrs. Howard C. Lotz, and measured 70 feet by 120 feet. The original building was 28 feet wide and 60 feet long. Since that time a large kitchen, fully equiped has been added to the structure. The evergreen trees that stands beside and to the rear of the hall were purchased and planted by Howard C. Lotz and Henry T. Kephart shortly after the hall was built. The committee charged with the building of the Grange hall in 1928 was composed of Vernor T. Waite, Sr., David G. Roseberry and M. C. Lotz while the funds were solicited by Miss Verna Miller, Miss Maude Williams and Earl Chrismore.

All of the records of the Grange since its organization in 1875 are intact and available, and these records indicate that the Grange, like many other organizations, had its periods of difficulty, but yet was sufficiently substantial to continue its activities and to carry on the program of the Grange. One of the outstanding events in the early days of the grange was in February 1890 when fourteen candidates were given the third and fourth degrees of the Order and a live goat was furnished for the occasion by Thomas C. Coleman, then master. This is the only known time in the history of the Sinking Valley Grange that a live goat was actually used in an initiation ceremony. There are 50 members who have been Patrons for 25 years or more. The present membership of Sinking Valley Grange is 109.

The main purpose of the founders of the Patrons of Husbandry was to promote the social, moral, intellectural, financial and agricultural welfare of the rural people without interfering with or overlaping the activities of any other group. And in this the Sinking Valley Grange has been successful. And during the years the Grange has gladly responded to appeals for aid from members of other Granges. It has contributed, throughout the years, to all worthy causes including the American Red Cross, Far East Relief, the Blair County Tuberculosis and Health Society. the girls' dormitory at Pennsylvania State College, the cancer society, heart fund, community chest, the new National Grange home in Washington, D. C., the European Milk Funds, National Grange Youth Leadership Fund, the Altoona Hospital & \$100.00 to the Tyrone Hospital building, and many other projects.

The various Sinking Valley 4-H clubs have held their meetings in the Grange hall and the first Sinking Valley Community Farm Show was sponsored by and held in the Grange hall in 1931. These shows have been held each year since that time in the Grange hall, although the show are now conducted by the Sinking Valley Farm Show Association, an incorporated organization. The Grange hall is used as a community center and as a meeting place by various organizations for various farm and dairy conferences.

In 1949 the Grange sponsored a recreation ground and a baseball team which won the Tri-Good County League championship. Od - Mod and the Tri-Good County League championship.

The Sinking Valley Grange has, over a period of years, established an enviable record of attainment in Grange ritual work, membership increase, sponsoring choral groups which have won county and regional prizes, and per capita contributions to various granges and community projects.

The Grange celebrated its 75th anniversary
March 16, 1950. Miller J. Waite, Chairman.
